

An Arizona Master of Real Estate (MRE) is an active member of the Arizona Association of REALTORS<sup>®</sup>. Membership recognizes the individual's dedication to excellence through professional education and commitment to staying abreast of the latest real estate regulations and practices.

To hold the MRE certification, the member must:

- Be a REALTOR<sup>®</sup> in good standing
- Hold an NAR-recognized designation (earned after completion of 90 hours of classroom instruction and examinations)
- Hold another NAR-recognized designation or be a candidate for another designation awarded by the NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF REALTORS<sup>®</sup> (NAR)
- Take 54 hours of continuing education during the two-year period immediately prior to application or renewal
- Earn 10 points through additional educational classes, attendance at NAR or AAR conferences, or service on local, state, or national committees

Additionally, the criteria must be met every two years to maintain an active status in the Society. The minimum educational requirements to renew a real estate license in the state of Arizona, is 24 hours of continuing education every two years. A Master of Real Estate is an individual who has far exceeded the minimum.
