3.) LAKE HAVASU CITY ASSOCIATION:

The Lake Havasu Association of Realtors continues to progress during this pandemic. Our REALTOR Member numbers are holding steady with 732 and our Affiliate Member numbers are up slightly with 87. Our local market continues to thrive with under 200 homes listed for sale at any given time over the past six months and new construction still outpacing last year's numbers. For the time period beginning March 1st, 2020 to the end of September, compared to 2019 March through September, the number of active listings are down 28% and the number of homes sold is up 7% with the dollar volume of sales rising 26%.

Our September General Membership meeting was held via Zoom with Senator Sonny Borelli as our special guest. He updated us on the state of the Capitol and how things were going as we near the November elections. Our next General Membership meeting is scheduled for January and is slated to be held in person at the Realtor Center with guest speaker Scott Drucker.

Our Association has reopened while following both the Governor's guidelines and the guidelines set forth by the CDC. We have and will continue to take all necessary measures needed to keep both our Association members as well as the general public safe. Last month we started holding our weekly Wednesday marketing meetings in person as well. The turnout has been fantastic, ranging anywhere from 30 to 60 attendees at any given meeting.

Our committees have been starting to meet in person, everyone has been pleased with the personal interaction.

The Government Affairs committee has been very busy recently keeping up on the elections and the recent issues that have come to light regarding our local water rights. Last week our Government Affairs Chair, Richard Gomez, met with Lake Havasu City Mayor Cal Sheehy, to discuss the Resolution of the Mayor and City Council opposing the transfer of Colorado River water. The meeting was also attended by Bullhead City Mayor, Tom Brady.

The RAPAC Chair, Hilary Sosey and her committee are in full swing readying for our RPAC Auction, to be held mid-November. They are hoping to increase our major investor numbers and will be showcasing several high dollar items to bid on. The auction will last a week and is going to be just in time to kick off the holiday shopping season!

Our Public Relations Chair, Judy Tassie, has done an amazing job raising funds despite COVID-19. We were able to give away over \$25,000 earlier this year helping several local charities get the resources they needed to assist so many of our residents in desperate need due to the effects of the pandemic. Judy had hoped to hold more events this fall; however, they have been moved to next year's Realtor Olympics' agenda as a result of the continued concerns regarding COVID-19.

Despite the overall setbacks of 2020, as an Association we have remained diligent, stayed on course, and emerged Stronger Together!!

4.) YUMA ASSOCIATION OF REALTORS:

Membership count: 646 Primary Members, 57 Secondary Members

Activities: Our office is still operating mostly remote and scheduling by appointment only if necessary to access the office.

Due to Covid restrictions we were unable to hold an in-person director and officer election. We held an online election on September 24, 2020 and it went well.

Rapac: Our Rapac Committee held an online auction similar to the one held by AAR to raise funds in lieu of our major investor event. We raised a little over \$7,000. We have reached all of our Rapac Goals for the year, and are at 200% of overall goal, 55.86% participation and with pledges, 14 total Major Investors.

We are working on a video campaign to kick off next year's investment participation.

WeSERV is launching a large community outreach event – Festival of Trees providing trees to families throughout our jurisdiction primarily working with the Boys & Girls Clubs, a couple of schools, House of Refuge & a handful of individuals. The goal is to distribute 100 trees. This will be our first Association-wide Community Outreach project that includes all 4 Chapters and many volunteers from across the association.

Continue to offer Free CE Classes, free Zoom CE classes, multiple designation classes (all via Zoom) and continue our Speaker Series. We hosted Shay Hata in September and will have Johnathan Hawkins in November.

Will be launching a Diversity & Inclusion Workgroup to explore and recommend ways to make sure our members are educated on these issues as well as doing outreach to the communities we serve.

Our next General Membership meeting is scheduled for December 1st.
